#### **GRAND SLAM GLORY FOR RORY McIIROY**

#### **The Masters 2025 Review**

Grand Slam for Rory Mcllroy at Augusta was delivered as a illustrious career career continues to unfold.

Rory McIlroy beat Justin Rose in a playoff to win the Masters Tournament and join golf's most exclusive club by completing the career Grand Slam.

The Northern Irishman captured his fifth Major title at Augusta National after a thrilling final round which saw four different players find themselves in at least a share of the lead.

Victory makes the World Number Two only the sixth man to win all four Majors and the first since Tiger Woods in 2000, joining an elite club also containing Gene Sarazen, Ben Hogan, Gary Player and Jack Nicklaus.

It was McIlroy's 11th attempt to write his name in golfing immortality, having ticked off the other three between 2011 and 2014.

"It feels incredible," said McIlroy. "This is my 17th time here and I started to wonder if it would ever be my time.

"I think the last 10 times, coming here with the burden of the Grand Slam on my shoulders and trying to achieve that – I sort of wonder what we're going to talk about going into next year's Masters!

"I'm absolutely honoured and thrilled and just so proud to be able to call myself the Masters champion.

"When I hit the wedge shot into the creek on 13 – I feel like I did a really good job of



bouncing back from that – and the double-bogey at the first as well.

"There was a lot of pent-up emotion that just came up on that 18th green but a moment like that makes all the years and all the close calls worth it.

"I want to say hello to my mum and dad back home in Northern Ireland. I can't wait to celebrate this with them."

The day started as a head-to-head between McIlroy and American Bryson DeChambeau, the foe who had ensured his Major drought stretched into an 11th year by beating him at Pinehurst in last year's U.S. Open.

McIlroy, who went into the final round two shots clear, made the worst possible start

as a wayward drive at the first was followed by a three-putt for a double-bogey six.

The 35-year-old found sand off the tee on the second and could only manage a par as DeChambeau birdied the par five to take lead.

However, there were further two-shot swings on the third and fourth and both went in McIlroy's favour.

He birdied the third from ten feet, then saw his playing partner miss a par putt on the same line from seven feet.

DeChambeau then bogeyed the short fourth after missing the green as McIlroy birdied after an outstanding tee shot to nine feet.



### **GOLF IRELAND PROFESSIONALS RECEIVE OVER** €350,000 IN FUNDING FROM SPORT IRELAND

Golf Ireland have announced details of the 2025 Golf Ireland Professional Scheme, with nine elite Irish golfers set to benefit from €350,000 in funding provided by Sport Ireland.

he scheme was officially launched at the Golf Ireland Academy in Carton Demesne, Maynooth, Co Kildare with Minister of State for Sport Charlie McConalogue TD attending alongside Sport Ireland representatives and several of the beneficiaries, including Conor Purcell, Lauren Walsh, Max Kennedy, Mark Power, Alex Maguire, and Annabel Wilson.

Each of the nine players selected for the scheme will receive €33,000 in support, enabling them to compete internationally and continue their development. Sara Byrne, Anna Foster and Liam Nolan are also recipients in 2025.



### THE FIRST TEE

Three new celebrities have signed up for 'The First Tee' with former Paralympic swimmer and gold medallist Ellen Keane, ex-Ireland international footballer Stephanie Zambra, and personal coach and fitness influencer Nathalie Lennon coming on board this year.



he First Tee' is Golf Ireland's social media campaign with the goal of encouraging more women to consider taking up the game of golf, by seeing women they follow embark on the challenge of learning how to both play and get into the sport over a 12-week period.

The trio, who are all new to the game, recently had their first lessons at the driving range. In the coming weeks, they will attend a Get Into Golf session along with likeminded beginners and a Chip & Chat evening, joined by female golfers of all ages and abilities.

Their crash course will culminate at the KPMG Women's Irish Open Pro-Am on 2 July in Carton House. Last year it was Muireann O'Connell, Kayleigh Trappe and Ailbhe Garrihy who took part as they were introduced to golf.

Keane became Ireland's youngest ever athlete when she swam at the Beijing Paralympic Games in 2008 before she went on to win gold at Tokyo 12 years later. However, she believed her disability might have held her back in golf.

"When I got asked to do this, I was afraid of not being able to hit the ball and the perception is you don't see a lot of disability when it comes to golf," said Keane.

"I've never seen a one-armed golfer, so I was afraid because I had not seen it before, that I wouldn't be able to do it.

"So, when I met with Cian Arthurs, he's one of the Irish golfers with one arm, he put all my worries aside and showed me what I was able to do. I was a little bit afraid that I might need a prosthetic, but he showed me I don't need a prosthetic to do golf.

"Anything that I need to do I already have on me, which was really really good and gave me a lot of confidence, that I would be okay with this."

Former Republic of Ireland international, Zambra, scored a famous goal in 2013 which saw her finish second in the Puskas Award behind Colombia's James Rodriguez. She recently took on a Women's First Team Coaching role at Shamrock Rovers, having retired from playing duties with the Hoops last year.

"Previously I haven't had much lessons, I always had an interest in it," said Zambra.

"Growing up, in my estate we were quite lucky, we had loads of open fields and lots of open spaces so whenever any sport is on TV we were always out playing it, and golf was one of them.

"My brother had a set of golf clubs in the house, I used to steal his golf clubs every now and again, take one and go out and hit the ball, so I had an interest in it from a very young age.

"My dad used to bring us to the driving range up in Stepaside as well but never had proper structure to what I was doing, so I'm really excited to get some help and lessons."

Having qualified as a personal trainer in 2016, Lennon is a health and fitness coach who spreads her message based on body confidence, sustainable habits, and an optimal relationship with food and fitness.

"My experience with golf has been extremely minimal, second to none," said Lennon.

"I've been to a driving range, maybe twice in my life, so a lot of nervous excitement right now. Today will definitely be my first time really picking up a golf club.


"At the driving range a couple of years ago, I picked it up but I didn't know how to hold it, what way to use it, so today would be an experience for sure."



### McILROY'S MASTERS GRAND SLAM ENHANCES IRELAND'S REPUTATION AS THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

After a dramatic final play-off, Rory McIlroy became the first golfer from the island of Ireland to win The Masters, and only the sixth ever in the history of the game to win the Grand Slam of all four men's Majors (The Masters, US PGA Championship, US Open and The Open Championship).



or a small island on the edge of Europe, Ireland is a powerhouse when it comes to golf, with McIlroy, Padraig Harrington, Graeme McDowell, Darren Clarke and Shane Lowry all recent winners of Major titles. With world-class courses in some of the most spectacular locations on the planet, it's not surprising that Northern Ireland is where McIlroy first honed his skills.

McIlroy first joined Holywood Golf Club at the age of seven, becoming the club's youngest ever member. Set high in the Holywood Hills of County Down, the club boasts a picturesque 18-hole parkland course, with stunning views over the Belfast Lough and the Antrim Coast. Just a short drive from Belfast City Centre, the course has an unrivalled location.



The club is just one of a number of world-class golf courses in Northern Ireland, a region which boasts over 90 courses, ranging from gentle links and parkland courses to challenging championship courses, ensuring both seasoned golfers and beginners can find the perfect green.

McIlroy also has a long history with Royal County Down Golf Club, a notoriously challenging course which he credits as the course that taught him how to plan shots and be more methodical in his game as a teenager. Located in one of the world's most naturally beautiful links settings in the Murlough Nature Reserve, it is set against the magnificent backdrop of the Mourne Mountains, in the seaside town of Newcastle. The picturesque links course stretches along the shores of Dundrum Bay offering a dramatic panorama as well as an unforgettable golfing experience.

McIlroy's historic Masters victory looks set to create even more interest in the return of The Open Championship to Royal Portrush. More than 250,000 people are expected to flock to the Co. Antrim course in July to see the best golfers in the world in action when The Open returns. Also loved by acclaimed Irish golfers including Harrington and Lowry, the courses are overlooked by the ruins of the 13th century Dunluce Castle, giving its name to Royal Portrush's famous Dunluce Links, among the world's most challenging golf courses.

Throughout Northern Ireland there are many iconic courses including Ireland's oldest golf club, Royal Belfast, which dates from 1881. The charming links layout overlooks Belfast Lough and was chosen by Harrington, Open champion in 2007 and 2008, as one of his top 30 courses. Over in the beautiful Fermanagh Lakelands the championship Faldo course at Lough Erne Resort, designed by six-time major winner Sir Nick Faldo, combines outstanding scenery with holes that will test and delight players of all abilities; whilst Royal Portrush's neighbouring course - Portstewart Golf Club on the north coast - is home to three fine true links golf courses with the backdrop of the Atlantic Ocean, golden beaches and rugged coastline.



Harrington, one of Ireland's most celebrated golfers, remains a fan favourite wherever he plays, and his return to The K Club is set to be a highlight of the week. 

The 35-year-old found sand off the tee on the second and could only manage a par as DeChambeau birdied the par five to take lead.

However, there were further two-shot swings on the third and fourth and both went in McIlroy's favour.

He birdied the third from ten feet, then saw his playing partner miss a par putt on the same line from seven feet.

DeChambeau then bogeyed the short fourth after missing the green as McIlroy birdied after an outstanding tee shot to nine feet.

McIlroy looked set to pull further clear when he produced a remarkable approach from among the trees down the left of the seventh to eight feet and DeChambeau found the front bunker.

However, McIlroy left his birdie putt a fraction short and DeChambeau produced a superb shot from the sand to save par.

First-round leader Rose birdied the 11th from 58 feet moments after berating himself for bailing out short and right with his second, then birdied the 12th after a fine tee shot to 17 feet to move level with DeChambeau on nine under.

Ludvig Åberg soon made it a three-way tie for second with his third birdie of the day on the tenth.

However, the trio found themselves four behind as McIlroy took advantage of a huge drive at the ninth to complete an outward 35.

Rose birdied the long 13th to take outright second but McIlroy swiftly restored his four-shot advantage by converting from 15 feet at the tenth.

Åberg found a bunker on the 12th and Rose's drive finished stuck behind a tree on the 14th, with the Green Jacket seemingly at McIlroy's mercy at that stage.

DeChambeau found water with his approach to the 11th and double bogeyed as his challenge faded around Amen Corner but McIlroy failed to take advantage of a huge slice of luck as his second stopped inches short of the same fate only to then fail to get up and down.

Rose responded to his bogey with a birdie at the 15th to close within three.

McIlroy's serene progress was abruptly halted as he hit a pitch into Rae's Creek from inside 100 yards at the 13th and double bogeyed, with Rose birdieing the 16th from five feet to suddenly join him in share of lead.

McIlroy briefly relinquished his share of the lead with a bogey on the 14th after leaking his drive right but Rose failed to get up and down at the 17th, with Åberg suddenly finding himself in a three-way tie for the lead after birdieing the 15th.

McIlroy looked blocked out down the left off the tee at the par-five 15th but hooked a magnificent approach a fraction over the drink, with the ball feeding round to eight feet.

A tame eagle putt left the World Number Two with a tap-in birdie to retake the lead.

The drama was far from done. Rose made his tenth birdie of the day as he holed a 20-footer on the last for a stunning round of 66.

McIlroy hit a superb tee shot to ten feet on the 16th but missed the birdie chance as Åberg three-putted the 17th before a triple-bogey at the last.

McIlroy almost holed his seven-iron approach to the penultimate hole before tapping in from two feet to take a one-shot lead up the last.

A perfect drive was followed by a leaked approach which found the right bunker but after splashing out to five feet, he missed the putt before making no mistake at the second time of asking as a closing 73 left him tied with Rose on 11 under.

Patrick Reed took third on nine under after a closing 69, with defending champion Scottie Scheffler a shot further back in fourth.

#### THE 153rd OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP AT ROYAL PORTRUSH

History will be made at The 153rd Open at Royal Portrush after it was revealed by The R&A that 278,000 fans will gather at the iconic Dunluce links from July 13-20 for the largest Championship held outside of St Andrews.



xcitement among fans at The Open's return to the Antrim Coast after the success of the Championship in 2019 led to unprecedented demand for tickets in the ballot last year with applications for more than one million tickets.

The attendance this year will surpass the previous high mark set at Royal Portrush six years ago when 237,750 fans celebrated Irishman Shane Lowry complete a memorable win in The 148th Open with a six-shot victory over Tommy Fleetwood.

Mark Darbon, Chief Executive at The R&A, said, "The Open is one of the world's great sporting events and we will do everything we can to make this year's Championship at Royal Portrush an outstanding and memorable occasion for everyone involved from fans to players and the millions watching on TV and digital platforms worldwide.

"The passion and enthusiasm for golf throughout the island of Ireland is world-renowned and is clearly reflected in the extraordinary demand among fans to be part of this historic occasion. We look forward to welcoming a record crowd to these spectacular links for a true celebration of golf and seeing who emerges from the 156-strong field to become Champion Golfer of the Year."

The 153rd Open will also be the largest ever sporting event held in Northern Ireland and is expected to generate more than £213 million in total economic benefit for the country according to an independent forecast by the Sport Industry Research Centre (SIRC) at Sheffield Hallam University.

It estimates that the economic impact resulting from The 153rd Open will be  $\pounds 63$  million, while the destination marketing benefit for Northern Ireland derived from coverage produced via linear television and digital platforms will exceed  $\pounds 150$ m.

"It's clear that staging a major event such as The Open can generate significant economic benefits for the locations in which they are held and this study demonstrates the huge benefit that the Championship brings," said Darbon.

"We are grateful to the government and local agencies in Northern Ireland for their investment and support in bringing the Championship back to Royal Portrush after the success of 2019. Their enthusiasm and expertise has been crucial to our planning and we thank them for the work they have contributed towards making this possible."

Aine Kearney, Director of Events at Tourism Northern Ireland, said, "The 153rd Open at Royal Portrush is nearly there and excitement is building and all the partners

involved in the delivery of the Championship are working in collaboration to make it even bigger and more memorable than 2019.

"The Open in 2019 brought huge economic benefits, not just to the North Coast, but to the whole of Northern Ireland and 2025 will be no different.

"It is shaping up to be another world-class sporting event which presents us with an invaluable opportunity to further raise Northern Ireland's profile as a must-see travel and golf destination as well as a fantastic place to invest."

The Open continues to be one of the most accessible major sporting events for young people thanks to The R&A's long-running Kids Go Free initiative. More than 27,000 tickets are available for those under the age of 16 and there are reduced price tickets for fans under the age of 25. Since Kids Go Free was launched in 1997, 434,000 children have attended The Open for free.

A record 89,000 spectators will attend the four sold-out Practice Days of The 153rd Open, exceeding the total of 61,000 fans who attended the equivalent days at Royal Portrush in 2019.

The Open Camping Village continues to prove a popular accommodation option among families and young people with 4,600 guests booking a place to stay on-site this year. Almost a third (32%) of those staying at the village are under the age of 25 meaning that 20,000 free bed nights have been provided to this group since the initiative was launched at Royal Troon in 2016.



its magnificent views, this 18–hole parkland course, Par 71, is a gem. The irregular city, with its towers and steeples spread before the eye along the valley, and in the west, Slievenamon and the Comeragh Mountains, make a background of enduring splendor.

Nearby Tramore is a small but charming seaside village twenty minutes from Waterford city. Tramore Golf Club, an 18–hole parkland course is situated on the outskirts of Tramore and offers visitors a superb gently undulating course and top notch facilities including a pro shop, club bar and restaurant.

Dunmore East Golf Club overlooks the village of Dunmore East, County Waterford in the South East of Ireland. Here Rosslare Golf Links boasts a spectacular landscape standing on a narrow peninsula with the Irish sea on one side and Wexford harbour on the other. Two courses are on offer at this club including an 18–hole championship course and a 12–hole layout known as the Burrow Course that opened in 1992.

While in Wexford, visit St. Helen's Bay Golf Resort, a club steeped in history and boasting a challenging course with spectacular views over the Irish Sea.







# THE DUNAS COURSE AT TERRAS DA COMPORTA **RETAINS NO.1 RANKING IN PORTUGAL**

The international popularity of The Dunas Course at Terras da Comporta has been further underlined after the venue was named as the number one golf course in Portugal by users of a respected industry website for the second year running.



he acclaimed par-71 layout near Lisbon – architect David McLay-Kidd's first golf design project in mainland Europe which opened in October 2023 was the overwhelming first choice in Leading Courses' updated 'Golfers' Choice Awards 2025'.
